*About the language: English is recommended. (Japanese is acceptable.)

*The title should be within 50 double-byte characters, or 100 single-byte characters.

[Regarding text fields in Japanese]

Use characters included in JIS level 1 and 2.

Please note that some characters used on Japanese computers may not properly be displayed on other computers. (Machine dependent characters)

For special characters used in some Japanese names, please replace them with the closest characters included in JIS level 1 and 2. (e.g. 高 can be replaced with 高, and 崎 with 崎)

Circled characters (㊦㊧), circled numbers(㊱㊲), and other special symbols (kg mm (株) 議) cannot be used.

For Roman numerals, do not use special symbols (I II III); instead, use combinations of alphabets like I, IV, and IX.

Do not use half-width (single-byte) Katakana characters.

For Chinese or Korean names with Kanji characters which cannot be replaced with JIS level 1 and 2 characters, and for other non-Japanese names without Kanji spellings, please use alphabets for the name field, where Kanji is usually used for Japanese names.

Do not use Gaiji (characters only valid in a specific settings), Kumimoji (a single double-byte character containing several small letters in multiple rows), or lines, which you created yourself.

For Greek letters (α , β), use double-byte characters. (Single-byte Greek letter will automatically be converted into regular alphabets such as a and b.)

You can use the following double-byte, arithmetic symbols included in JIS level 1 and 2. (→←↕↔%‰Å+ - ±×÷ = ≠ ≡ ≒ ≓ ∞ ∞ ∞ ⊆ ⊇ ⊃ ⊂ ∪ ∩ ∧ ∨)

When using < > & " by themselves, always use double-byte characters. (e.g. $p < 0.05$, $CO > 2.2$)

Use single-byte numeric characters for phone number and postal codes. Make sure the number of digits is correct for fields such as phone number and postal codes.

[Regarding text fields in English]

The following fields should be filled in English.

Email address, the name of the organization (in English), and author's names (in English). Text in an abstract should also be in English.

For fields to be filled in English, you can use the following single-byte alphanumeric characters and symbols.

(A-Z, a-z, 0-9, ! # \$ % - ' = + ~ { } ? , . : @ [] * _ / and single-byte spaces)

Characters and symbols not listed above cannot be used. Do not use characters such as ó ö é á ç, and

please use regular alphabets. Double-byte spaces cannot be used, either. Please use single-byte spaces. A single-byte apostrophe (') can sometimes be converted to a double-byte character automatically when creating a document in Microsoft Word. If you copy and paste the created text into a form field, it will cause errors when registering the data. Please enter a single-byte apostrophe manually in the form field. Single-byte < > “ & cannot be used.
